Israeli warships on Tuesday 31.05.210 intercepted a Jewish activist boat trying to run the naval blockade on the Gaza Strip after it refused to heed calls to change course, organizers told AFP.

For this set of drawings I selected 20 film stills of the Israeli army footage, which Israel broadcasted to legitimate their raid on the boat coming from Turkey. In this context, we can also percieve this footage as a propaganda movie.


